SIDCUP PARTNERSHIP SUPPORT BURNT OAK

On Tuesday 14th May we welcomed Cheryl Curr from Sidcup Partnership to Burnt Oak Buzz for an exclusive interview to thank them for their generous support this year. They kindly supplied Journalism Club with exercise books, pens, pencils and lanyards in the Autumn Term & have recently agreed to help us purchase desktop publishing software for the ICT Suite.

Can you tell us about Sidcup Partnership? Sidcup Partnership is made up of over 400 businesses all based in Sidcup. Two years ago they all voted to become part of a club called Sidcup Partners. Everyone pays a small amount of money per year and it is put into a bank account. We use the money to put on services, events and a whole range of things that we do. I am the manager and work three days a week, managing all the projects that we do. I communicate with all the businesses & make sure that they get value for money. I also do the bookkeeping and administration, such as health & safety at events.

How have you helped reduce plastic in Sidcup? Plastic is one of my favourite projects; I got quite upset seeing how much plastic ends up in our oceans & I was invited to the Brazilian Embassy, where I saw pictures showing the awful situation of animals dying by eating or getting trapped in prices of plastic. I thought it would be a really good thing if we could reduce the amount of single use plastic used in Sidcup. We approached the locals in the High Street asking them to pledge to join us with this, we also bought and distributed some cloth bags to reduce people buying plastic bags in the supermarket, we visited lots of shops and asked if they would use alternatives to plastic, such as using wooden spoons or offering money off if a customer used their own cup. This project has been running for about a year; most of the shops and many people have been very positive about it. We have a small enthusiastic steering group who are keen on helping by litter picking and often organise 'treasure hunts' where locals can get involved. On one occasion, in one hour three black sacks had been collected. We are hoping to win an award for our efforts.









We also participate in London in Bloom and pay for the hanging baskets around the town centre; when the judges come they think about how pretty the flowers are and how well they've grown, as well as judging us on what the environment is like and how clean it is; so this project along with the plastics & littering all connect.

Is there anything we could do to help? You could get involved in a litter pick, we are hoping to make our next one super hero themed. I'll let you know the dates.

How do you help local schools? For secondary schools we offer work experience, we are helping one local primary school pay for training for their staff, we have distributed plants, seeds, pots and compost locally & we are helping Burnt Oak by purchasing a laptop and software for the ICT Suite.

How do you decide who to help and how much to give? We have a board of directors who are all volunteers, made up of people from different sectors in the town centre such as from the police, a publican, a small shop, & a larger shop and for larger amounts of money we all have a vote. Some of the decisions go back to our manifesto, such as supplying two ways radios for the town centre and the hanging baskets etc.

Is there an age limit for the board of directors? There is no age limit.

So I could be on it? Yes you could be on it and share your thoughts, but you would not necessarily get a vote; having said that because Burnt Oak pays to be a part of the club it means the school has a vote. I would be more than happy to have a representative come to the meeting from your school, it would be great to have you on board, you could share your good ideas.

That's good, as it'd be great to have different age groups represented - I am interested! Sub Editor





Library Online Help

MINECRAFT CAKE

Ingredients

Makes: 1 real Minecraft cake For the cake

230g unsalted butter, softened

250g caster sugar 4 eggs

2 teaspoons vanilla extract 300g plain flour

75g cocoa powder

3 teaspoons baking powder

1/2 teaspoon salt

275ml milk

To decorate

400g marzipan red food colouring icing sugar, for dusting

Method

4 tablespoons strawberry jam Preheat oven to 180 C / Gas 4. Grease two 23cm (9 in) square cake tins and dust with flour or cocoa powder.

> Cream together the butter and sugar until light and fluffy, about 4 minutes. Beat in the eggs, one at a time, beating well after each addition. Add the vanilla.

> In a separate bowl, sift together the flour, cocoa powder, baking powder and salt, then add to the butter mixture alternately with the milk, gently mixing between each addition. Divide the cake mixture evenly between the two prepared cake tins.

> Bake for 30 to 40 minutes in the preheated oven. Cake is done when it springs back to the touch. Remove from oven and let cool in the tin for 10 minutes before turning out onto a wire rack to cool completely.



After half term, our aim is to publish our podcasts regularly over the rest of the term.




